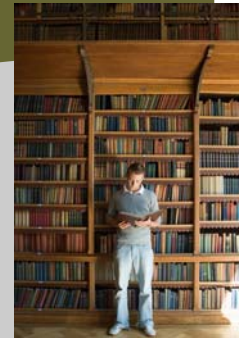

COURSES OFFERED:

HTH101 Church of God Distinctives - History

A survey of the deep and rich origins of the Church of God Reformation Movement, including the global expansion and an introduction to the important figures within the movement. Also students will become aware of the current landscape, and important influences facing the Church of God movement both internationally and within Western Canada.

THO102 Church of God Distinctives - Doctrine (Theological Overview)

This course will afford the student the opportunity to explore the central doctrines of the Church of God Reformation Movement and especially consider their Biblical basis. The exploration will include Bible Study, reading from historic documents and current literature. It is expected that the student will be conversant with those doctrines upon successful completion of the course and be able to identify their posture in relationship to the historic doctrine of the Church of God.

1. **CONTINUING EDUCATION TRACK (AUDIT)**
(for lay persons who want to learn more about COG History and Doctrine) \$150/course
(Those that apply for the Pathways Fund—the price is reduced by \$50)
2. **PROFESSIONAL TRACK (CREDENTIALING)**
(for clergy or persons taking this course for Credentials requirements) \$200/course
(Those that apply for the Pathways Fund—the price is reduced by \$50)
